



Wheelchair Users - Policy

Wheelchair Entry & Registration

- Unless stated otherwise on the event webpage, the event is suitable for wheelchair users.
- During the registration process, entrants must indicate whether they will be participating in a self-propelled wheelchair or a standard wheelchair with assistance (pushed).
- For those requiring an assistant (support runner), both the wheelchair entrant and the support runner must be registered for the event.
- A complimentary entry can be provided once the wheelchair entrant has secured their own entry. Participants must contact support@runsouthlondon.com with the name and email of the support runner to receive an entry form (see below Support Runners Policy).
- We will allocate support runner places on a first-come, first-served basis and they may be subject to event and distance capacity limits.

Wave Allocation & Race Day Logistics

- Assisted wheelchair participants and assistants' starting position will be at the back of your allocated wave to support a consistent start to the race.
- Self-propelled wheelchair participants will be assigned a start wave based on your predicted finishing time.
- Events are staged under IPC (International Paralympic Committee) rules, and self-propelled wheelchair athletes must conform to the British Wheelchair Racing Association (BWRA) minimal classification race system.

Fast Paced/Elite Wheelchair Athletes

- Elite and fast paced wheelchair users will be allocated a priority start position to ensure you are positioned appropriately within the race field.
- Participants using racing chairs must meet competitive classification criteria and will be managed by the Elite Team.
